This year's award is \$1,000, and the deadline for receipt of applications by the Community Foundation of Ottawa, is **May 1, 2012**.

To apply, applicants must:

- 1) submit a one page letter to Community Foundation of Ottawa (suite 301, 75 Albert Street, Ottawa ON K1P 5E7) outlining their musical goals and aspirations, their current financial situation, and why this award is important to them .
- 2) obtain a letter of reference from their supporting organization (The Irish Society of the National Capital Region), or The Ottawa Fiddling and Folk Art Society, or the Renfrew County Fiddlers Association).


