Quick and Easy Soda Bread

In their book *Irish Pub Cooking*, Love Food offers a recipe that is so easy, even CCE PRO Lisa can make it!

Here's a simple recipe that you can bring to the next céilí or serve at the next family dinner:

Ingredients:

Vegetable Oil, for brushing

4 cups all-purpose flour, plus extra for dusting

1 tsp salt

1 tsp baking soda

1 1/4 cups buttermilk

Instructions:

- ♦ Preheat oven to 425 F or 220C. Brush a baking sheet with oil.
- ♦Sift the flour, salt, and baking soda into a bowl. Make a well in the center and pour in most of the buttermilk. Mix well, first with a wooden spoon and then with your hands. The dough should be very soft but not too wet. If necessary, add the remaining buttermilk.
- ♦ Turn out the dough onto a lightly floured counter and knead lightly and briefly. Shape into an 8-inch/20-cm round. Put the loaf onto the prepared baking sheet and cut a cross in the top with a sharp knife.
- ♦Bake in the preheated oven for 25-30 minutes, until golden brown and the loaf sounds hollow when tapped on the bottom. Transfer to a wire rack and let cool slightly. Serve warm.
