Another Caint is Comhrá Successful Irish Language Immersion Weekend!!!

The12th annual event, sponsored by the Irish language group, Caint is Comhrá, under the auspices of CCE, Ottawa, was held at the beautiful Galilee Retreat House on the last weekend of September. The experience of being in a totally Gaelic atmosphere was enhanced by the gorgeous weather and the serenity and peace that this venue provides. We were blessed to have 2 young Irish teachers, who are visiting scholars attached to Concordia and U of O. In addition we had the help of our regular local teaching talent which is thriving in an atmosphere, where classes and conversation groups are available.

Gaeilgioirí or Irish language enthusiasts came from London On, Kingston, Brockville and Montreal and we had a record attendance.


Two people who have played a huge role in advancing the use and knowledge of an Gaeilge, were honoured at the Saturday evening Siamsa. Mary Coffey who has taught for years up to the present day and Rosemary O' Brien who teaches Irish at the University of Ottawa, were presented with floral bouquets by Paula Molloy from The Embassy of Ireland.

Caint is Comhrá provides bursaries to students who are eligible to enable them to participate more fully in the Irish Community.

The bursaries are named as follows:

- 1. The Mary Coffey Bursary given to a candidate taking TEG, which is a standardized test of competency in Irish, defined by the European Language TestingCentre. { TEG= Teastas Eorpach Gaeilge }
- 2. The Rosemary O' Brien Bursary, is given to enable attendance at the Immersion Weekend in Galilee.
- 3.The Pat and Deirdre Scott Bursary allows a student to attend the Irish Language Summer camp held every August in the Gaeltacht in Tamworth. Of particular note is the amount of musical and artistic talent present at the Siamsa. It was truly amazing to watch so many young people and some not so young, share their gifts through

song dance or playing an instrument. A memorable weekend!!

Stability of earth,


Firmness of rock.
